Tiger Baccarat is a Baccarat derivative, offering a new set of wagers and payouts for Baccarat. The game uses eight (8) standard fifty-two (52) card decks.

Base Game

The base game uses standard Baccarat rules.

The payouts are:

- If you wager on the Player and the Player bet wins; the payout odds are 1 to 1.
- If you wager on the Banker and the Banker bet wins; the payout odds are 1 to 1. .
- If you wager on the Tie and the Tie bet wins; the payout odds are 8 to 1.
- If you wager on the Player or Banker and the Tie bet wins; the wager is pushed.

Available Side Bets

Tiger Baccarat offers optional wagers that may be used on a Baccarat table in conjunction with any other existing optional wagers. The Tiger wagers are known as "Tiger", "Small Tiger", "Big Tiger", and "Tiger Pair". All bets must be placed before any cards are dealt.

Once all wagers are placed, the game is dealt following standard Baccarat rules and procedures. After the Baccarat hand is completed, all side wagers are resolved.

How to Play Tiger

1. To play Tiger simply place a wager in the Tiger betting area of the layout. If the banker wins with a score total of six (6), you win. The payout odds are dependent on how many cards the Banker has when the hand is complete.
2. If the Banker has two cards, this is known as a "Two Card Tiger" and the payout odds are 12 to 1.
3. If the Banker has three cards, this is known as a "Three Card Tiger" and the payout odds are 20 to 1.

How to Play Small Tiger

1. To play Small Tiger simply place a wager in the Small Tiger betting area of the layout. If the banker wins with a score total of six (6) and has exactly two (2) cards, you win. The payout odds are 22 to 1.

How to Play Big Tiger

1. To play Big Tiger simply place a wager in the Big Tiger betting area of the layout. If the banker wins with a score total of six (6) and has exactly three (3) cards, you win. The payout odds are 50 to 1.

How to Play Tiger Pair

1. To play Tiger Pair simply place a wager in the Tiger Pair betting area of the layout. If either or both of the Player's and Banker's hands first two cards are a pair, you win. There are three potential winning outcomes.
2. If only one of the hands has a pair on their first two (2) cards, this is known as a "Single Tiger Pair" and the odds paid are 4 to 1.

3. If both hands have a pair on their first two (2) cards, this is known as a "Double Tiger Pair" and the odds are 20 to 1.
4. If the pairs in both hands have matching number or matching picture cards, then this is known as a "Twin Tiger Pair" and the odds are 100 to 1.

For example;

If the Player hand has two queens as their first two cards and the Banker hand does not have a pair on their first two cards, this is a Single Tiger Pair and pays 4 to 1.

If the Banker hand has two nines as their first two cards and the Player hand does not have a pair on their first two cards, this is also a Single Tiger Pair and pays 4 to 1.

If the Player hand has two Kings as their first two cards and the Banker hand has two Eights as their first two cards, this is a Double Tiger Pair and pays 20 to 1.

If the Player hand has two Jacks as their first two cards and the Banker hand also has two Jacks as their first two cards, this is a Twin Tiger Pair and pays 100 to 1.



Tiger Pair Pay Table

Tiger Bets

Tiger bets win when the Banker hand wins with a score of 6.

Wager	Pays
Two Card Bets If the banker wins with a score total of six (6) and has two (2) cards	12 to 1
Three Card Tiger If the banker wins with a score total of six (6) and has two (3) cards	20 to 1
Small Tiger If the banker wins with a score total of six (6) and has two (2) cards	22 to 1
Big Tiger If the banker wins with a score total of six (6) and has two (3) cards	50 to 1

Tiger Pair Bets

Wager	Pays
Single Tiger Pair Player or banker have a pair	4 to 1
Double Tiger Pair Player and banker have a pair	20 to 1
Twin Tiger Pair Player and banker have identical pairs - both hands have matching number or matching picture cards	100 to 1
