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Raise 'Em Poker is an easy and fun game that appeals to all players.

Raise 'Em Poker Overview

Raise 'Em Poker is a variation of five-card stud poker played with a single deck of cards.

Instead of betting against the house and other players, players bet on the strength of their own three-card hand in combination with the two community cards held by the Dealer.

A player wins according to the payable (see over) if their five-card hand results in a pair of tens or better.





How To Play Raise 'Em Poker

1. Each player must place a minimum ante bet in the ante box in front of him before the dealer deals. Each player is dealt three cards. The dealer then deals three cards to themselves, face down. If using an automated card shuffler, the top card is discarded. If shuffling by hand only two cards are dealt.
2. The remaining two cards are then dealt to community box 1 and community box 2 face down.
3. Players may now view their own three cards and are offered the option to raise their initial bet by placing an additional bet, equal to their ante bet, on their own betting box marked '1'.
4. Once players wishing to raise their bets have done so, the dealer turns over the first community card. This card becomes the fourth card in each player's hand.
5. Players are now given a second option to raise their bet – again by placing a bet in their betting box marked '2' (this bet must be equal to their ante bet).
6. The dealer now turns over the second community card, which becomes the fifth, and final card in each player's hand. Players with winning hands are now paid by the dealer on each bet they have placed (one, two or three bets) during the game.
